FOREWORD

Political cartoonists serve up satire, caricatures and dark humor that can be controversial, if not subversive, even in free societies with long histories of unfettered media and open debate. In countries where independent thought is repressed and even criminalized, the resonance of visual commentary can be a lifeline.

Wang Liming, also known as Rebel Pepper, honed his craft in his native China, where the government is more famous for censorship than for a sense of humor, and where often grim political and human rights topics do not lend themselves easily to light treatment. His success in giving expression to the thoughts of his thousands of followers on both taboo subjects and everyday experiences drew the wrath of the mighty Chinese Communist Party.

Forced to leave his homeland in 2014, Rebel Pepper first found haven in Japan before settling in Washington, DC. Throughout his journey he continued to hone his craft, challenging Chinese state-controlled narratives and expanding his graphic editorials for Radio Free Asia, where there is no room for censorship.


Like all great cartoonists, Rebel Pepper masters the art of making big statements with few to no words. He is able to use humor, irony, imagery and caricature to create cartoons that are meaningful to audiences of diverse cultural and political backgrounds and sensibilities.

This collection of 50 cartoons shows Rebel Pepper not only applying his insightful wit to hot topics in his native China, but also expanding the scope of his work to tackle issues from North Korean nuclear provocations to Cambodian political machinations to the Rohingya humanitarian crisis. In each instance he renders nuanced geopolitical complexities into sharp, digestible, and relatable pieces of visual art.

China's loss here has been a gain for Radio Free Asia and the world. It is with great pride that we present his work to you.

The move comes ahead of major meetings of China's ruling Communist Party later this month.




UYGHUR STUDENTS IN EGYPT DETAINED, SENT BACK TO CHINA



A Hong Kong court jails former leaders of massive 'Umbrella Movement' protests that swept the Chinese city in 2014.







At the time of his death, Liu had been serving an 11-year jail term for "incitement to subvert state power."






AILING POLITICAL PRISONER HAUNTS PRESIDENT XI JINPING'S HONG KONG VISIT

Chinese President Xi Jinping, visiting Hong Kong to mark 20 years of rule by China, was met on arrival in the former British colony with calls to release writer and democracy activist Liu Xiaobo. Liu, 61, is being treated at a hospital in northeastern China, following a diagnosis of late-stage liver cancer. Liu was already in jail when he was awarded the 2010 Nobel Peace Prize "for his long and non-violent struggle for fundamental human rights in China" in a decision that infuriated Beijing, which put his wife under strict house arrest.



NOBEL LAUREATE LIU XIAOBO HOSPITALIZED WITH TERMINAL LIVER CANCER

Chinese writer and democracy activist Liu is currently being treated at a hospital in Liaoning's provincial capital Shenyang. Liu was awarded the 2010 Nobel Peace Prize "for his long and non-violent struggle for fundamental human rights in China" in a decision that infuriated Beijing, which says he has broken Chinese law.




CALLS IN HONG KONG FOR UNIVERSAL SUFFRAGE ARE MET BY CHINESE REFUSAL

China is North Korea's closest ally.



EXILED BILLIONAIRE AS SUPPLICANT

Exiled Chinese billionaire Guo Wengui, also known as Miles Kwok, grew a massive Twitter following with lurid revelations of high-level corruption. But his declaration that he will not oppose the Communist Party and will support President Xi Jinping have cast his motives in doubt.


